Q: What is TAG?

A: **TAG** is the **Teen Advisory Group** for the Halton Hills Public Library. It's open to high-school-aged teens in Halton Hills.

Q: What does TAG do?

A: When you decide to stop being a member of TAG (when you graduate, for instance) you simply talk to the TAG coordinator who will provide you with a letter stating your volunteer time with us.
